Family	Proteaceae				
Habit	A tall shrub or small tree; can grow up to 20m but is reduced to a shrub in exposed coastal sites.				
Habitat / threat	A very wide range, common in sandy coastal areas down to sea level, but also grows in the forests of tablelands.				
Leaves	Mature leaves 5 -15 cm long and 2-7 cm wide, stiff, entire (untoothed), dull dark green above and hairy-white underneath. Younger leaves are irregularly toothed and shorter than the mature leaves.

Flowers	Upright, cylindrical heads of pale-yellow flowers 5-15 cm long and 7cm wide. Flowers January – June.				
Fruit/seed	The seed pod is cone-like, with scattered capsules, which open with two rounded, woody lips. Seeds are papery and winged.
