

The inaugural aRRRRRt Awards, a special collaboration between EcoNetwork Port Stephens and Artisan Collective Port Stephens, celebrates EcoNetwork's Sustainable Futures Festival.

All finalists will be on display and winners announced on 11th September at the Sustainable Futures Festival in the grounds of St Philip's Christian College, Salamander Bay. An independent, esteemed artist from Newcastle will have the difficult job of selecting the winners from a very competitive pool.

A cash prize pool of \$1000 is up for grabs. The Open Adult prize is worth \$500 and the Secondary School Prize is \$250. The winner of the Primary School prize is \$250 and a serve of gelato from Jetty Gelato for every student in the classroom! There is also a noncash prize for the People's Choice Award.

The aRRRRRt awards recognise artists' creativity to put the R into aRt: Rethink, Reduce, Reuse, Repurpose or Recycle.
